



ROCKY MOUNTAIN YOUTH CORPS 2024 Eagle-Holy Cross Trail Crew Member

- Partner Agency:** US Forest Service White River National Forest- Eagle-Holy Cross Ranger District
- Positions Available:** 2
- Location:** Minturn, CO
- Tentative Dates:** May 20 - August 24, 2024 (or upon completion of 14 weeks).
- Stipend:** \$625/week living allowance. Total amount will be \$8,750.
- AmeriCorps:** 450-hour AmeriCorps Education Award (\$1,824.07) upon successful completion
- Plus:** Boot/gear reimbursement up to \$400
- Public Land Corps Hiring Authority upon completion of 640 hours on public lands.
- Housing allowance up to \$175/week provided. Single occupancy rooms are available to rent from Vail Resorts for approximately \$750/month. Shared living space with a shared kitchen, bathroom, and laundry. No pets allowed in Vail Resorts housing. Candidates are welcome to search for housing elsewhere in the surrounding areas. Housing can be very expensive, bedrooms in a shared house can be up to \$1000/room. Candidates are responsible for extra housing costs over allotted stipend.

Program Overview:

This position will serve as part of the Eagle-Holy Cross Ranger District Trail Crew, which will be a crew of 4-6 members maintaining over 600 miles of non-motorized trails on the Eagle-Holy Cross Ranger District. Service duties include trail corridor clearing with chainsaws and cross-cut saws, and feature construction and maintenance. Service may be completed in partnership with volunteer groups. Crosscut and chainsaw certifications, along with other hand and power tool training will be provided by the Forest Service. Priorities for the 2024 season include supporting projects funded by the Great American Outdoors Act, which include small structure replacement, tread repair, drainage feature construction, and other tasks to bring trails back to FS specification. This position requires overnight camping in remote locations for up to 4 days/3 nights of backpacking in duration or 4/10 hour day trips. It also requires extensive hiking (up to 15 miles per day), strenuous labor, heavy backpacks (up to 50 lbs.) and public contact. The Forest Service may be able to supplement some backcountry items such as tents, backpacks, stoves, water filters, communication devices and first aid kits. Each person selected must provide sturdy leather high-top hiking boots, sleeping bag, water bottles, non-cotton base layers, socks, and winter hats, rain gear and any other personal items for backcountry travel.

General Qualifications:

Experience in recreation management is preferred but not necessary. The successful applicant must have good communication and people skills and be able to serve with and communicate effectively with a wide range of people and personalities. Must have the ability to serve outdoors and unsupervised. This is an incredibly mentally and physically demanding job.

Individual must be able to serve as a team member, be responsible, and if living in government housing, must keep their space clean

Service Statement:

Requirements:

- High School Diploma or equivalent
- 18 Years of age or older with a valid driver license and clean driving record.
- Eligibility to work in the US
- This position is supported by the Public Lands Hiring Authority which requires candidates to be between the ages of 16 to 30.
- Pre-service background screening required, including FBI background check
- Must be able to provide proof of eligibility to work in the United States

CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT: AmeriCorps members will be subject to all state and federal laws, and the rules and regulations of OSHA and RMYC. The member is expected to fully understand and adhere to the rules, regulations and code of conduct as described in the AmeriCorps member manual. 10/19 Policy violations will result in disciplinary action according to program guidelines, including written warnings, fines, suspension without stipend, and/or termination. The AmeriCorps member is accountable for meeting or exceeding the responsibilities of this position as described above, and will be evaluated at mid-term and end-term by Corps Program Staff, with input from project hosts. Successful completion is contingent on both AmeriCorps education award hours and service through the agreed upon term end date.

This position is classified as Temporary Exempt and is a seasonal position with no benefits. Rocky Mountain Youth Corps is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
