- Partner Agency:** US Forest Service White River National Forest- Dillon Ranger District
- Positions Available:** 2
- Location:** Silverthorne, CO
- Tentative Dates:** May 20th – September 23rd, 2024 (or upon completion of 18 weeks).
- Stipend:** \$625/month living allowance. Total amount will be \$11,250.
- AmeriCorps:** 675-hour AmeriCorps Education Award (\$2,626.27) upon successful completion.
- Plus:** Boot/gear reimbursement up to \$400
Up to \$175 per week housing stipend
Public Land Corps Hiring Authority upon completion of 640 hours on public lands.
Shared housing is available at Keystone Ski Resort at a subsidized rate.
Rooms are single occupancy with a shared kitchen, bathroom and laundry.
Training and certifications provided may include first aid/CPR, defensive driving, and Thinking Sawyer chainsaw training. All field gear is provided including a work pack, first aid supplies, personal protective equipment and Forest Service uniform.

Program Overview:

Duties for this position vary, consisting of patrols and projects in support of the Designated Dispersed Program in Summit County:

- Public education and information of Forest rules and regulations to Forest visitors.
- Patrol front country trailheads and dispersed areas adjacent to mountain communities to educate on Leave No Trace practices and Forest regulations.
- Patrol Forest Service roads via trucks and/or UTV's providing motorized recreation information to forest users.
- Install and maintain trailheads, road signs, access gates, and information kiosks.
- Implement and support the motorized and non-motorized travel management plan (where motorized and mountain bikes are authorized to go) via signage, gates, barriers, and visitor education.
- Perform maintenance and clean dispersed and trailhead facilities including bathrooms.
- Assist with volunteer projects with local partner clubs as scheduled.
- Collect and maintain field data using tablets and maintain photographic data of summer work.

General Qualifications:

- Strong positive attitude
- Good team member and interpersonal skills to solve day to day problems as a cohesive team
- Ability and comfort to work outdoors for long periods of time in inclement weather
- Comfortability making public contacts frequently
- Skills with hand and motorized tools (drills, hammers, generators, pumps, weed whackers, hand saws, pole saws etc.)

Service Statement:

Requirements:

- High School Diploma or equivalent
- 18 Years of age or older with a valid driver license and clean driving record.
- This position is supported by the Public Lands Hiring Authority which requires candidates to be between the ages of 16 to 30.
- Pre-service background screening required, including FBI background check
- Must be eligible for enrollment in AmeriCorps as a US Citizen, National, or Lawful Permanent Resident. Documentation will be required on the first day.

CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT: AmeriCorps members will be subject to all state and federal laws, and the rules and regulations of OSHA and RMYC. The member is expected to fully understand and adhere to the rules, regulations and code of conduct as described in the AmeriCorps member manual. 10/19 Policy violations will result in disciplinary action according to program guidelines, including written warnings, fines, suspension without stipend, and/or termination. The AmeriCorps member is accountable for meeting or exceeding the responsibilities of this position as described above, and will be evaluated at mid-term and end-term by Corps Program Staff, with input from project hosts. Successful completion is contingent on both AmeriCorps education award hours and service through the agreed upon term end date.

This position is classified as Temporary Exempt and is a seasonal position with no benefits. Rocky Mountain Youth Corps is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
