Program Overview:

Performs a limited variety of tasks such as:

- Functioning as rod person on land surveys that require specific rodding and leveling procedures. In accordance with established procedures, selects the measuring or turning point according to the terrain and demands of the type of survey involved.
- Functioning as head of the measuring crew on routine, repetitive surveys. Using established methods and procedures, selects measuring points by considering terrain, necessity of balancing observations, and demands of the type of survey and equipment involved. Independently carries through a sequence of standard operations, directing the work of other crew members.
- Measuring slope distance, and converts to horizontal distance by using a variety of surveying instruments.
- Functioning as target set-up person under a variety of standard conditions. Using a reconnaissance sketch, locates stations and orients positions. Erects and levels survey targets, orients targets at observing stations, and adjusts the brightness, focus, and direction of targets according to directions from observers using radio or light signals.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

General Qualifications:

- Ability to perform physically demanding tasks for long periods of time, walk over steep, rocky, and uneven terrain, sometimes in dense vegetation.

- A positive attitude and desire to learn new skills is essential for this position.
- Must have a strong work ethic with a positive attitude and desire to learn new skills.
- Must also have the ability to serve independently in remote locations in a variety of weather conditions.
- Must work well with others in a crew-based environment.

Requirements:

- High School Diploma or equivalent
- 18 Years of age or older with a valid driver license and clean driving record.
- This position is supported by the Public Lands Hiring Authority which requires candidates to be between the ages of 16 to 30.
- Pre-service background screening required, including FBI background check
- Must be eligible for enrollment in AmeriCorps as a US Citizen, National, or Lawful Permanent Resident. Documentation will be required on the first day.

CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT: AmeriCorps members will be subject to all state and federal laws, and the rules and regulations of OSHA and RMYC. The member is expected to fully understand and adhere to the rules, regulations and code of conduct as described in the AmeriCorps member manual. 10/19 Policy violations will result in disciplinary action according to program guidelines, including written warnings, fines, suspension without stipend, and/or termination. The AmeriCorps member is accountable for meeting or exceeding the responsibilities of this position as described above, and will be evaluated at mid-term and end-term by Corps Program Staff, with input from project hosts. Successful completion is contingent on both AmeriCorps education award hours and service through the agreed upon term end date.

This position is classified as Temporary Exempt and is a seasonal position with no benefits.
